



### March 2013 Update

A meeting of the Sauganash Community Association was held on March 19, 2013 at the North Shore Community Bank..

The Communication and Website Committee reported that the final draft of the website is completed and we are ready to sign the contract.

The Fourth of July Committee was scheduled to meet with the Park District but the meeting was canceled due to the birth of a baby.

The Membership Committee reported that we have 701 members.

The O'Hare Noise Committee presented a report. The FAA so far has refused to address any of our concerns, let alone justify its actions regarding the big increase in late night/early morning aircraft noise over our area, per the FAA Plan effective October of this year. Residents are urged to attend and seek answers at Alderman Lauren's Community Meeting on aircraft noise changes in April at North Park Village. Residents are also urged to contact Congressman Mike Quigley, Mayor Rahm Emmanuel, and President Barack Obama.

The Traffic and Safety Committee said that the two schools, Queen of All Saints and Sauganash Elementary are meeting to talk about the traffic safety issues

The movement to create community gardens on the Skil Craft Site has failed to meet approval by the property owners.

It was reported that the Sauganash Mural Project is on schedule for summer completion. Whole Foods is giving a Donor Recognition Day for the project on April 25<sup>th</sup>. All orders for donor recognition tiles must be in by April 19 and photos submitted by April 26<sup>th</sup>. It was suggested that members of the Board and the Community drive by the other murals under Lake Shore Drive to see how large and visible an 8 X 8 tile really is. People who have not reserved tiles may regret not being included in the mural.

The local Sauganash Elementary School Council approved the use of the school for our Spring open meeting in May. Possible invitees are Alderman Laurino and the new commander of the 17<sup>th</sup> precinct. There may also be a presentation by the Sauganash Mural Project and an introduction to the new SCA website.

Finally, it was reported that we are working on getting the speed bumps painted.
