



October 2012 Update

A meeting of the Sauganash Community Association was held on October 16, 2012 at the North Shore Community Bank.

The Finance and Donation Committee Chair presented recommendations to the Board in response for funding. The Traffic and Safety Committee reported that the speed bumps will be painted, and the circle turn around on Rogers was cleaned. The Committee needs to meet to discuss the fact that the crossing guard at Kilpatrick was moved to Forest Glen. Many children are still crossing at Kilpatrick, and this causes a hazardous situation.

Marge Laurino's Trail Committee met, and Board Members in attendance reported that the bike trail is in good condition.

The Board discussed Holiday Party Options presented by Special Events Committee. A motion was made that there will be a party this year, but next year the event will be re evaluated. After discussion the motion was approved. The likely party date will be the first Friday in December.
