The SCA has contracted with a private firm to provide curb-to-curb snow plowing service to supplement the City plowing, which only covers the center of the street. The SCA may request the curb-to-curb snowplowing when single snow events meet or exceed 4 inches (neither the City nor our private service will plow alleys). Whenever possible please remove cars from the street when we are expecting a large snowfall. The SCA will do our best to provide as much advance notice of snowplowing as possible via email blasts, Facebook updates and Twitter feeds. We appreciate everyone's patience and cooperation with the heavy snowfall events that occurred the first week of January. These were made especially challenging with the high winds, drifting, and sub-zero temperatures.

Please go to www.fairchicago.org to sign a petition to halt increased air traffic over Sauganash. You can also find a link there to register a noise complaint and information on contacting local officials to voice your opinion. A noise complaint can also be registered by simply calling 311. Aldermans Margaret Laurino and Mary O'Connor are sponsoring a resolution to hold hearings in the City Council over the increased traffic in Chicago and west and northwest suburbs. In addition, Congressman Quigley has agreed to sponsor a meeting with Mayor Emanuel on this issue.

The 17th District of the CPD has been sending bicycle officers to monitor the Sauganash Bike Trail to establish a presence and keep the trail safe.
